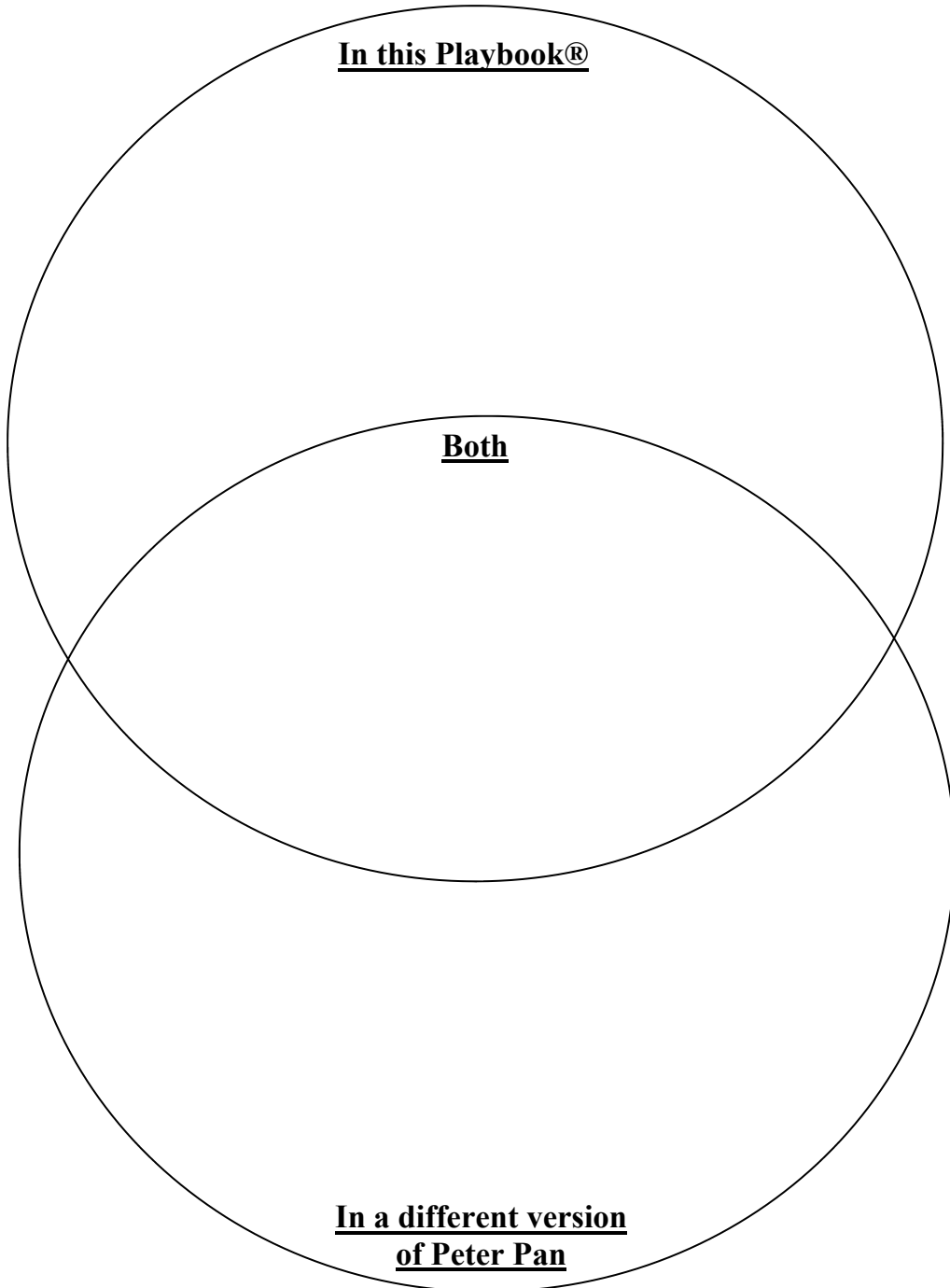

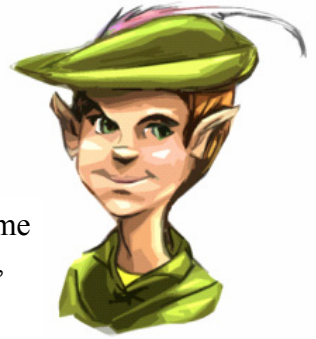
Character Twist

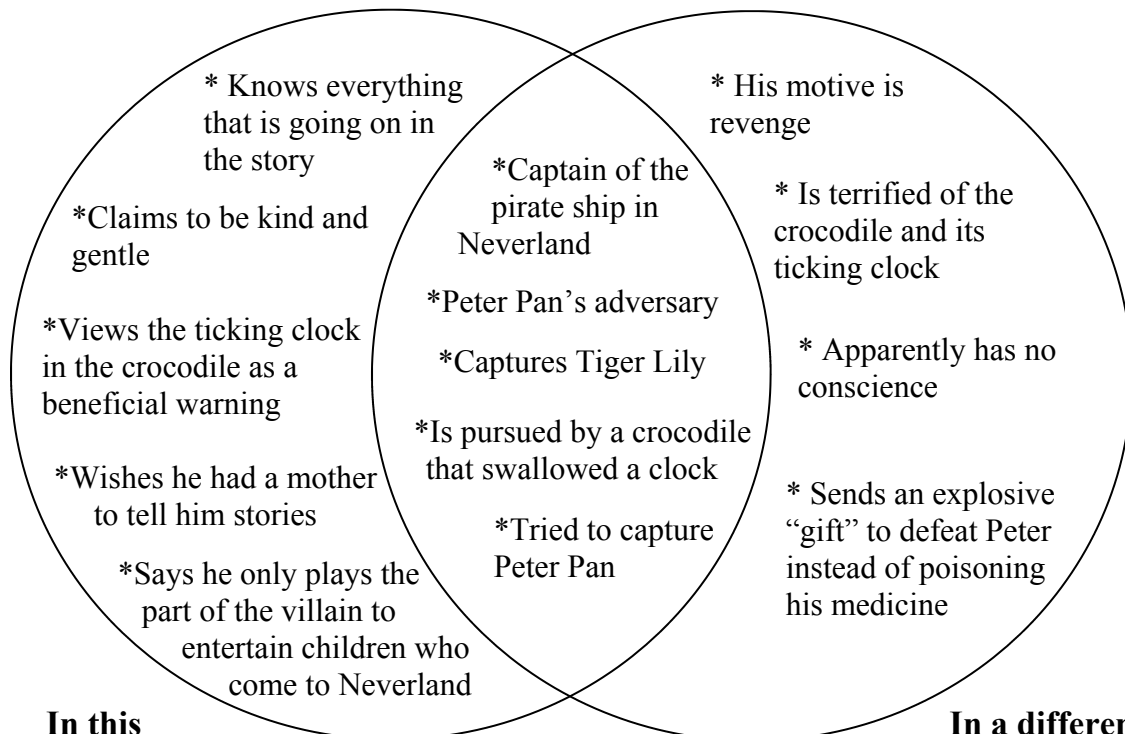
